

***In the County Court of the State of Oregon for Harney County
Minutes of the County Court
May 6, 2015***

The Harney County Court convened in Judge Steven E. Grasty's office at 10 a.m. on Wednesday, May 6, 2015. Members attending were Judge Steve Grasty, and Commissioner Pete Runnels and Commissioner Dan Nichols. Also attending were Eric Drushella, Roadmaster and Derrin (Dag) Robinson, County Clerk.

Others in attendance included Samantha White, Burns Times Herald

Judge Grasty led all in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner Runnels made a motion to approve the minutes from the April 15 and 16, 2015, County Court meetings. Commissioner Runnels seconded, the motion carried unanimously.

Vouchers were approved by Court signature.

Public Comment

Kate Marsh was present and provided an update on the cultural coalition. Dan moved to recognize the plan and review for future approval, Commissioner Runnels seconded, the motion carried unanimously.

The court reviewed an application for approach from Chris and Channing Nesbit off of Monroe Lane, in order to attach to City water services. It is basically a utility easement. Commissioner Runnels moved to approve the application for a utility easement, Commissioner Nichols seconded, the motion carried unanimously.

Bill Dragt, was present to discuss the BLM Integrated Invasive Plant Management Program, Mr. Dragt asked for a letter of support, including the need for incorporating right-of-ways in to the plan. Judge Grasty will draft a letter.

At 11:00 a.m. the court opened bids for asphalt. Bids received were as follows:

Idaho asphalt- \$434.90/ton

Western States Asphalt-\$ 447.00/ton

Albina Asphalt- \$480.00/ton

Roadmaster Eric Drushella recommended the bid be awarded to the low bidder, Idaho Asphalt. Commissioner Nichols moved to award the bid to Idaho Asphalt, Commissioner Runnels seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

Angie Uptmor and Peggy Yarbor with Community in Action provided a program update to the court.

John Lamborn, Chair of Harney Malheur housing authority was also present to discuss the correlation between the two programs.

Commissioner Runnels moved to authorized Judge Grasty to sign a certification agreement regarding Community in Action Programs. Commissioner Nichols seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Dag Robinson, County Clerk discussed a test the counties are doing to collect data regarding mail delivery times between areas in the state. The Data is being collected to determine how long it takes for returned ballots to be delivered to counties during an election. Results will be reported at a later date.

Resolution 2015-07 Establishing Archive Fund. Commissioner Runnels moved, to sign Resolution 2015-07 Establishing the Archive Building Enterprise Fund. Commissioner Nichols second, the motion carried unanimously.

The Court had a brief discussion on Biomass Boiler project, but will have discussion with counsel about the contract as well.

The Court recessed at 12:05 p.m., and reconvened in executive session as per ORS192.660 (2)(c) at 1:20 to consult with legal counsel regarding litigation or litigation likely to be filed. The court reconvened regular session at 1:40 p.m., no action taken.

Court discussed again the Biomass boiler project.

The Court held a conference call at 3:00 p.m. with several other County Courts and boards of Commissions to discuss requesting a supplemental EIS regarding the Sage Grouse matter. It was a consensus of the Harney County Court, Malheur County Court, and Lake County Commission to send a letter asking for cooperation.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.



hereby make application to the County Court of Harney County, Oregon for approval to install a culvert and/or approach off the County Road of Harney County, described as follows:



1. All Agriculture practices should be completely exempt from any new rules.

- While it has been repeatedly stated that ag is not to be included in any rule there is a undercurrent to measure new ag development. This could have the same impact as inclusion.

2. Any new rule at LCDC or ODFW should be area specific.

- The rules should state which counties!

3. Counties should be involved at all levels including a vote in decision making processes that impact the communities economically and/or socially. Examples of this:

- Mapping LIT's and planning commissions should be required to collaborate and jointly approve changes to mapping.
- Mitigation Counties recommend a committee to set mitigation on projects include Counties along with Business Oregon representatives to assure environmental/economic and social balance.
- There shall be an appointed "mitigation" committee to review and set the final mitigation requirement on a land owner which includes Business Oregon and the affected county.

4. Counties will need absolutes to endorse any new land use or ODFW rule. (see terms below)

- To this date terms such as those below have not been clearly defined and when they have been the work appears incomplete or at least without local knowledge included.

5. Counties will agree to Avoid – Minimize – Mitigate only with the following criteria;

- **Clear definitions of terms**
- **Clear understanding of mapping and county involvement to establish original boundaries and changes.**
 - LIT process in some counties was not accurate
 - If LIT's meet to consider changes to boundaries, local involvement should be assured in rule. Require planning commission review and approval in each county.
- **Standards set for a time certain period to assure county's ability to make decisions into the future.**
 - These rules should be set for a 10 year (some other time frame?) so there is not constant change.
 - Counties recommend a review process at some point in the future, 10years?
- **Mitigation costs should not apply to residential or ag.**
 - The smaller the "development" the more onerous any mitigation costs will be.
- **Clear establishment of areas to be considered (i.e. Core only, Low Density? Or ????)**

- 6. Land owners should be compensated for being disallowed to develop or for being placed into a designation prohibiting/limiting development.**
- 7. Power lines should be exempt from consideration of disturbance.**
- 8. If Sage Grouse is ever “delisted/recovers” all this goes off table. Otherwise a rule with no application would remain on the books.**

RE: Appeal of BLM's Decision Notice for Comprehensive Recreation Plan

Background

This memorandum analyzes the potential for appealing the Bureau of Land Management's (BLM) decision to adopt the Comprehensive Recreation Plan (CRP). In particular, the County is interested in the potential for appealing the CRP based on the fact that it closed several miles of routes, called "Obscure Routes," to public use. The CRP also closed some Obscure Routes to all motorized use. To understand the context for this potential appeal, it is important to understand the agency decision making and litigation that precedes the CRP.

A. Travel Management Plan Litigation.

In 2009, the BLM issued a Travel Management Plan (TMP) for the Cooperative Management and Protection Area (CMPA) identifying 555 miles of routes open for motorized use, including 36 miles of routes called "Obscure Routes."

Harney County invested a significant amount of time with the public and affected landowners identifying existing routes within the CMPA designated by the Steens Act, culminating in the development of an official County map that was submitted to BLM as part of the TMP planning process. Afterwards, in consultation with the County and the Steens Mountain Advisory Council (SMAC), the BLM chose to leave 555 miles of existing routes open for motorized travel and to close just 1.23 miles. Included within those 555 miles of base routes were 36 miles of routes designated as "Obscure Routes." Since the BLM's adoption of the TMP, the County has been actively engaged in defending the TMP in litigation.

Five parties appealed the BLM's decision, resulting in a 2009 decision of the Interior Board of Land Appeals (IBLA) that reversed the BLM's authorization of motorized use of the Obscure Routes, effectively closing those routes. The IBLA found that authorizing motorized travel on routes that were obscure and hard to locate on the ground violated the Steens Act's prohibition on authorizing off-road vehicle use and new road construction in the CMPA because BLM authorized travel on routes that were not well defined or easily identifiable on the ground.

Subsequently one of the appellants, Oregon Natural Desert Association (ONDA), challenged the IBLA's decision in federal district court. One of ONDA's central strategies was to argue that more than 100 miles of additional routes should be closed on the same basis that the

Obscure Routes were closed—that they were obscure on the landscape. In 2012, the Oregon Federal District Court ultimately remanded the case back to the IBLA to reconsider its decision and address seven distinct legal issues raised by ONDA. However, prior to ordering the remand, in an April 19, 2011 opinion, the court noted that the IBLA’s reasoning may have been flawed:

[T]he IBLA reasoned, opening Obscure Routes to motorized vehicles amounted to permitting motorized travel “off road” and violated the Steens Act. ONDA is correct that the same logic appears to apply equally well to Historical Routes, which BLM defined in the EA as “currently hard to locate and/or were not identified during the WAS inventory process.” AR 9964. Nevertheless, ***I note flaws in the general thrust of this argument embraced both by the IBLA and ONDA, since it does not consider all the relevant language of the Steens Act.***

The argument relies on the notion that any route within a BLM route category defined as hard to locate on the ground cannot be a “road” and, therefore, cannot be opened to motorized travel without impermissibly endorsing “off road” travel. The Steens Act, however, contains a strange textual ambiguity. While § 460nnn-22(b)(1)(A) prohibits motorized “off road” travel, § 460nnn-22(b)(1)(B) permits motorized travel on “roads and trails” designated by the transportation plan. Thus, in the same breath, the Steens Act bans motorized vehicles on anything but “roads,” yet permits motorized vehicles on “trails.” ***This inherent contradiction undercuts the IBLA’s reasoning*** based on the definitions of Obscure Routes, and ONDA’s proposed extension of that reasoning to Historical Routes. Even if a route characterized as a Historical Route is hard to locate on the ground and thus cannot be a “road,” it could potentially be a “trail” which BLM can designate for motorized travel under § 460nnn-22(b)(1)(B). It is not my role to harmonize these apparently contradictory provisions of the Steens Act or to conduct a judicial review of the IBLA’s determination that opening Obscure Routes violated the Steens Act. It is sufficient at this juncture, however, to observe that while the IBLA neglected to consider the degree to which permitting motorized travel on so-called Historical Routes violated the Steens Act, it does not follow that the BLM necessarily violated the Steens Act by its designation of Historical Routes. Untangling this knotty Steens Act language and applying it to the facts of this case is a matter that should be tackled first by the agency.

Oregon Natural Desert Ass’n v. McDaniel, No. CV 09-369-PK, 2011 WL 1654265, at *14 (D. Or. Apr. 28, 2011) (emphasis added).

During the remand litigation, Harney County filed briefs with the IBLA urging the Board to vacate its 2009 decision closing the Obscure Routes. Harney County pointed out to the IBLA that the central basis upon which ONDA was challenging BLM’s route inventory was the same basis upon which the Board closed the Obscure Routes but that this reasoning was terribly flawed. The County explained that the mere fact that a road may become difficult to locate on the ground does not mean that the road does not exist. In a September 30, 2014 decision, the IBLA agreed with the County, vacating its decision closing the Obscure Routes and affirming the TMP in all respects. The IBLA’s decision reinstated all 555 miles of base routes, including the Obscure Routes, for motorized travel.

In rendering its decision, the IBLA stated that it agreed with the County “that, fundamentally, the case properly turns on the existence or non-existence [at the relevant date(s)] of roads and trails utilized by people for motorized access” and, further, that “the Steens [Act] could not have more broadly defined the character of routes open for motorized travel by allowing motorized travel on ‘roads and trails.’” 185 IBLA 87, 93. Consistent with these stipulations, the IBLA found that:

[The Steens Act] does not exclude routes that have become overgrown or otherwise naturally reclaimed, but whose line may be traced on the ground, or exclude routes that have been infrequently used in the past. Nor does it exclude routes that exist only as a matter of record. [...]

While difficult or hard to locate on the ground, routes that are obscure do, in fact, exist.

[...]

[T]he vast majority of the routes photographed confirm they exist on the ground at the location ONDA photographed, although they ranged from clearly existent to barely existent. Nonetheless, they existed, and accordingly could be designated by BLM, pursuant to section of the Steens Act.

185 IBLA 93-96.

The case is now back in front of the federal district court. Harney County has intervened as a defendant and intends to continue advocating in defense of the TMP. Currently pending is a motion by the Oregon Natural Desert Association seeking an injunction that would prohibit any motorized of any of the Obscure Routes.

B. The CRP Process.

BLM initially released a draft Environmental Assessment (EA) for the CRP in March, 2014. The BLM’s preferred alternative (Alternative D) would have chosen to pursue recreational site development but would have not closed any routes authorized under the TMP. However, BLM also considered two other alternatives (Alternatives B and E) which would close some routes in the transportation network. The County submitted comments supporting Alternative D but not Alternatives B and E, due to the proposed route closures.

Following the IBLA’s September, 2014 decision on the TMP remand, BLM released a revised EA for the CRP in January, 2015 that was intended to take into account the fact that the Obscure Routes had effectively been reopened to public use. In the January, 2015 EA, BLM added an additional alternative (Alternative B-1) and otherwise left the other alternatives unchanged. However, in leaving the other alternatives unchanged, choosing Alternatives B, C, D, or E would result in closing all of the Obscure Routes. Thus, the only alternative BLM considered in which all Obscure Routes would remain open would be under Alternative A, no action.

Harney County submitted comments on the January, 2015 EA. The County asserted that BLM failed to consider a reasonable range of alternatives, in violation of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), and that the BLM did not fulfill its obligations to consult with the SMAC prior to closing any of the Obscure Routes, in violation of the Steens Act.

On April 13, 2015, BLM executed a decision notice incorporating various aspects of multiple alternatives, including Alternatives B-1 and D. In essence, BLM chose to move forward with most of the recreational development proposals in Alternative D but also the route closures proposed in Alternative B-1. With respect to the Obscure Routes, BLM took the following actions: closed 12.84 miles; restricted 7.41 miles to administrative/permittee/landowner use only; designated 1.09 miles as ATV trail but not closed to full size vehicles; and left approximately 15.86 miles of Obscure Routes open for public use. The BLM also chose to close an additional 14.01 miles of routes to public use. Of those 14.01 miles of routes, BLM allowed for continued administrative/permittee/landowner use on 11.14 of the routes but closed 2.87 miles of routes entirely to any motorized use.

The County has 30 days from April 14 to appeal the BLM's decision to the IBLA. The County can also request a stay of the decision in filing the appeal, which would result in an expedited decision from the IBLA weighing in on the merits of the appeal.

Appeal Options

The TMP litigation has been complex and tortured. The litigation began in 2009 and continues to today. While the IBLA's September, 2014 decision reopening the Obscure Routes was a big win, it also complicated the litigation—and BLM's management of routes—even further. BLM further complicated the process of trying to address the Obscure Routes (and other route closures) in the CRP. However, the level of complexity, in my view, aids in a NEPA claim, arguing that BLM did not consider a reasonable range of alternatives. While these circumstances are unique, the County has a good argument that BLM should have sought public input on appropriate alternatives in light of the significant change to the environmental baseline when the Obscure Routes were reopened and, further, that BLM should have developed new alternatives in light of the changed baseline and public input. In a sense, in proposing to close Obscure Routes in every single action alternative prior to receiving public input, BLM made up its mind prior to completing the NEPA process that it would close Obscure Routes.

Similarly, Harney County has a good argument that BLM violated the Steens Act requirement that BLM consult with the SMAC prior to closing any routes. BLM stated in the March, 2014 EA that it consulted with the SMAC in 2013 and 2014 and that the SMAC issued criteria for route closures for BLM consideration but nowhere does BLM explain or document what that criteria was, or how BLM considered the criteria in its decision-making. Further, BLM states in the decision notice that it met with the SMAC in January, 2015 but, again, BLM provides no explanation or documentation of what the SMAC actually shared with BLM or how BLM considered the SMAC's input in making its decision. While courts have a lot of discretion in making these calls, this is the very essence of arbitrary and capricious decision-making, where the agency ignores factors that Congress expressly wished for the agency to consider.

If the County decides to go forward with an appeal, I recommend filing a motion requesting a stay. Not only would this allow for the opportunity of staying the effect of the decision (and thereby keep all Obscure Routes open)¹, this will allow a preview of how the IBLA views the case, which would inform future litigation strategy and decisions.

I. INTRODUCTION

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) is proposing to expand and update its existing integrated noxious weed management program. The Burns District currently controls noxious weeds under a District-wide 1998 Noxious Weed Management Environmental Assessment (EA) that analyzes treatments using a range of methods including manual, mechanical, biological controls (mostly insects), targeted grazing, prescribed fire, and herbicides (2,4-D, dicamba, glyphosate, and picloram). The District proposes to expand this program by:

- Increasing the kinds of plants controlled from noxious to all invasive plants; and,
- Increasing the number of herbicides to be used District-wide from four to 14.

Use of the additional herbicides was analyzed in the 2010 Vegetation Treatments Using Herbicides on BLM Lands in Oregon, Final Environmental Impact Statement in 2010 (2010 FEIS). This EA tiers to the 2010 FEIS, and analyzes herbicide and non-herbicide invasive plant treatment methods applied in an integrated management approach. It examines the environmental effects of the proposal at a site-specific scale within the Burns District and will replace the 1998 Noxious Weed Management Program Environmental Assessment for the Burns District.

Consistent with the EA and the analysis provided below, the Proposed Action would not constitute a major federal action that would have significant adverse impacts on the quality of the human environment. Therefore, preparation of an EIS for the Proposed Action is not required.

II. DETERMINATION OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Council on Environmental Quality's (CEQ) regulations provide that the significance of impacts must be determined in terms of both context and intensity (40 C. F. R. §1508. 27). An analysis of the context and intensity of the Proposed Action follows.

A. Context: In accordance with CEQ regulations found at 40 C. F. R. §1508. 27(a), the significance of an action must be analyzed in several contexts such as society as a whole (human, national), the affected region, the affected interests, and the locality. Significance varies with the setting of the proposed action. For instance, in the case of a site-specific action, significance would usually depend upon the effects in the locale rather than in the world as a whole. Both short and long-term effects are relevant.

The BLM has determined that the context of the Proposed Action is the 3.276 million acres within the Burns District, the surrounding air shed, and, for some effects, the interspersed private lands within the District.

B. Intensity: The following analyzes the intensity of the Proposed Action utilizing the ten significance criteria described in CEQ regulations found at 40 C. F. R. §1508.27(b):

1. Impacts that may be both beneficial and adverse.

The potential for herbicides to harm wildlife, fish, people, non - target plants, and other elements of the environment has been examined in detail in existing Risk Assessments (see Appendix C of the attached EA for a summary). Where the Risk Assessments identified a potential for an adverse effect, mitigation measures from the 2010 Vegetation Treatments Using Herbicides on BLM Lands in Oregon FEIS were incorporated into the Proposed Action. The Risk Assessments and the mitigation measures served as a primary information source for much of the analysis of effects.

The human health risk ratings are discussed for each herbicide in the Human Health and Safety section in Chapter 3 of the attached EA. That discussion shows that none of the potential risks to human health are significant, and that the Proposed Action would create less risk than the No Action Alternative, even though the Proposed Action would result in more acres treated with herbicides. This is a beneficial impact of the Proposed Action.

In addition to the foregoing, the EA demonstrates that the Proposed Action would reduce invasive weed spread in the Burns District when compared with the No Action Alternative. Additionally, the Proposed Action provides treatment options to control cheatgrass and other invasive annual grasses, and therefore will facilitate protection and rehabilitation of plant communities overrun or threatened by these grasses. Control of cheatgrass and other invasive annual grasses will also benefit Greater sage - grouse and other fauna, whose survival is dependent on native plant habitat. Given the adverse effects of invasive plants identified within the EA, the Proposed Action is expected to result in a beneficial effect.

2. The degree to which the selected alternative will affect public health or safety.

The EA demonstrates that the Proposed Action would have no negative affect on public health or safety. The herbicides included in Proposed Action have been examined by the BLM and Forest Service through Human Health Risk Assessments (Risk Assessment). The Risk Assessment - modeled scenarios, including direct exposure as well as subsistence - level ingestion of contaminated fruit and water, were deemed no risk for most of the herbicides under most scenarios. "No risk"

Action was also determined not likely to jeopardize the continued existence of these fish species. The extent of take authorized in the ARBO II correlates to the extent of treated areas outlined in the Project Design Criteria of ARBO II (i.e. less than, or equal to, 10% of the acres in a riparian reserve within a 6th field HUC watershed/year). In view of the foregoing, impacts to these species are not significant (see Fish, Special Status Species (Aquatic) and Other Aquatic Species, Wildlife, Special Status Species (Wildlife) and Migratory Bird sections of Chapter 3 of attached EA).

10. Whether the action threatens to violate Federal, State, or local law or requirements imposed for the protection of the environment.

The EA demonstrates that the Proposed Action complies with all Federal, State, and local environmental laws and other environmental requirements, including, without limitation, the Clean Water Act, Clean Air Act, and Endangered Species Act. Additionally, the Federal Land Policy and Management Act requires that any action that BLM implements must also conform with the current land use plan and other applicable plans and policies. The Proposed Action conforms with the management direction contained in the Andrews Management Unit and Steens Cooperative Management and Protection Area Resource Management Plan (2005), and the Three Rivers Resource Management Plan (1992) and records of decision and subsequent special area plans tied to it (see EA Chapter 1). It also conforms with (1) executive orders and various U. S. Department of the Interior policies regarding the use of herbicides and the management of invasive plants, and (2) the constraints and requirements adopted in the Record of Decision for the 2010 FEIS.

III. Finding

The potential impacts associated with the use of herbicides to treat noxious weeds and other invasive plants were previously evaluated in the 2010 FEIS. The impacts of herbicide use described for the Proposed Action analyzed in the EA generally fall within the range of those analyzed in the 2010 FEIS. In view of this, and on the basis of (1) the analysis contained in the attached EA, (2) the consideration of context and intensity factors described above, and (3) all other available information, my determination is that the Proposed Action would not constitute a major federal action which would have significant adverse impacts on the quality of the human environment. Therefore, an EIS for the Proposed Action is unnecessary and will not be prepared.



Initial Review and Proposed Final Orders

means exposure modeling scenarios resulted in dosages less than one - tenth of the lowest observable effect level identified during testing or simulations based on existing research.¹ Where the Assessments found risks above the lowest observable effect level, mitigation measures are identified to ensure that human exposures remain below the modeled scenarios. Mitigation measures include using lower herbicide application rates where feasible, prohibiting broadcast spraying, and posting warning signs in large application areas and high public use areas.

Human health risk ratings are discussed for each herbicide in the Human Health and Safety section in Chapter 3 of the attached EA. That discussion shows that none of the potential risks to human health are significant, and that the Proposed Action would create less risk than the No Action Alternative, even though the Proposed Action would result in more acres treated with herbicides. This is the same conclusion reached at the Statewide level in the 2010 FEIS, to which the attached EA tiers.

Program design features addressed in the EA to prevent risk of harm to tribal members also include meeting with interested local tribes to review herbicide treatment plans each spring, and signing treatment areas that correspond with traditional plant collection planned for that year. Standard Operating Procedures (see Appendix A, Water Resources section of the attached EA) prohibit use of non - aquatic herbicides near streams and other surface water. To avoid groundwater contamination, herbicides may not be used near drinking water sources.

The EA demonstrates that there would be no negative health or safety effect to low income or minority populations, or on the residents of towns or Class 1 air sheds.

3. The anticipated severity of the impacts to unique characteristics of the geographic area such as proximity to historic or cultural resources, park lands, prime farm lands, wetlands, Wild and Scenic Rivers, or ecologically critical areas.

There are no park lands or prime or unique farmlands located in the Burns District. Potential adverse impacts to riparian areas, wetlands, designated wilderness areas, Areas of Critical Environmental Concern/Research Natural Areas, designated and suitable Wild and Scenic Rivers, and Wilderness Study Areas, cultural resources, have been analyzed in Chapter 3 of the attached EA and were found to be insignificant.

4. The degree to which the effects on the quality of the human environment are likely to be highly controversial.

¹ The lowest observable effect may have been eye irritation, rash, or any other toxic effect. The Human Health and Safety section notes such effects are virtually all reversible when the exposure is eliminated.

BLM herbicide use proposals and herbicide use west of the Cascades are often controversial. However, the nature of the potential impacts associated with the current proposal to use additional herbicides to improve control of invasive plants on the Burns District is not highly controversial. Twelve scoping letters were received for this EA. The majority supported the use of additional herbicides because of the need to control invasive annual grasses. (The letters opposed included one suggesting not managing for invasive plants at all, one objecting to any herbicide use at all, and one requesting that prevention of invasive plants be the focus). A 30 - day period for the public, permittees, tribes, and other agencies to review the EA and FONSI will begin in late April 2015. This FONSI will be revised if resultant public comment indicates a need to do so.

5. The degree to which the possible effects on the human environment are highly uncertain or involve unique or unknown risks.

The BLM concludes that there is very little uncertainty regarding the Proposed Action's effects, that there are no unique risks associated with the Proposed Action, and that there is a very small chance that unknown risks associated with the Proposed Action will come to light. The BLM bases this conclusion on the following: (a) the Proposed Action was analyzed at the State - wide level in the 2010 Vegetation Treatments Using Herbicides on BLM Lands in Oregon FEIS; (b) the herbicides have been analyzed in the Risk Assessments, which examine wildland herbicide use and worker/public safety; (c) specialists familiar with District resources prepared the EA analysis; and (d) the EA utilizes sound science in assessing the potential impacts on soils, biological soil crusts, water quality, riparian areas, wetlands, aquatic habitat, special status aquatic species, native vegetation, invasive plants, Special Status plants, wildlife, Special Status wildlife species livestock grazing management, Native American interests and uses, cultural resources, recreation, visual resources, Areas of Critical Environmental Concern and Research Natural Areas, Wild and Scenic Rivers, Wilderness, Lands with Wilderness Characteristics, social and economic values, and human health and safety.

6. The degree to which the action may establish a precedent for future actions with significant effects or represents a decision in principle about a future consideration.

The Proposed Action does not establish a precedent for actions with potentially significant effects, nor does it represent a decision in principle about future consideration. The Proposed Action only applies to invasive plant management within the Burns District. Each of the other BLM Districts in Oregon will conduct an independent NEPA analysis to determine appropriate site - specific herbicide use within that District. No national or other precedent would be created by implementing the Proposed Action.

7. Whether the action is related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts.

Based on the analysis contained within the various resource effects sections in Chapter 3 of the attached EA, the Proposed Action would not have significant cumulative effects within the project area.

The analysis concludes that cultural site clearances, the incorporation of appropriate project design features, annual review of treatment plans with interested tribes, and other measures will prevent the loss or destruction of significant cultural or historical resources significant. Additionally, the Proposed Action will not adversely affect districts, sites, highways, structures, or other objects listed in or that are eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.

9. The degree to which the action may adversely affect an endangered or threatened species or its habitat that has been determined to be critical under the Endangered Species Act (ESA) of 1973.

There are four federally listed species known on the District, including one endangered plant (Malheur wire-lettuce), one endangered fish (Borax Lake chub), and two threatened fish (bull trout and Lahontan cutthroat trout). Although Canada lynx is a listed threatened mammal and has been documented on the District historically, no recent sightings, lack of prey base on public lands in the District, and lack of sightings on Forest Service lands to the north would indicate that this species is currently not in the area and will not be considered in the EA. In addition, there are three candidate species including the Greater sage-grouse, the Columbia spotted frog and the North American wolverine. The wolverine has been documented on the Steens Mountains but it is not known whether they are permanent residents or occasional strays due to the irregularities of the sightings.

There is designated critical habitat for both the bull trout and Borax Lake chub on public lands in the District. The effects to these species and critical habitat from the Proposed Action were determined through consultation with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service as part of the Aquatic Restoration Biological Opinion (ARBO II). Project Design Criteria for Invasive Plant Control outlined in the ARBO II were fully incorporated into Project Design Features of this EA. In the ARBO II, a May Affect, Not Likely to Adversely Affect determination was made for Borax Lake chub, Malheur wire-lettuce and their critical habitats. A Likely to Adversely Affect determination was made for Lahontan cutthroat trout and bull trout. The Proposed



Proposed Final Orders Regarding Applications for Extensions of Time for Water Right Permits

ORS 537.230, 537.248, 537.630 and 539.010 authorize the Water Resources Department to extend time limits contained in water right permits for completing construction of water development projects and applying water to full beneficial use. Procedures for permit holders to apply for extensions and for the Department to evaluate and determine whether or not to approve extensions of time are contained in OAR 690-320-0010 for extensions filed before July 1, 2001, and in OAR 690-315-0010 for extensions filed on or after July 1, 2001.

Proposed Final Orders (PFO's) are the Department's preliminary decision on extension requests. They document the agency's decision through specific findings. Persons interested in receiving a mailed copy of a PFO must pay a statutorily-required fee of \$25. (Any person paying to receive a PFO by mail will also receive a copy of the Final Order when it is issued). PFO's may be viewed for free at the Department's Salem Office or at the appropriate watermaster district office.

Extension of Time Public Notice and Comment Procedures

Written comments on or written protests against a PFO must be submitted on or before June 12, 2015. There is no fee for submission of comments. The protest filing fee is \$350 for the applicant and \$700 for non-applicants. Detailed requirements for filing a protest will be sent with copies of the PFO.



Dear Judge Grasty and Chairman Shoun:

I am writing in response to your letter to the Secretary of the Interior dated December 30, 2014, regarding your concerns for the well-being of ranching families in the Beaty Butte Grazing Association and, as their representatives, your request for assistance for these families. The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) stewards the lands that are included in the Beaty Butte Allotment, and your letter lists several challenging circumstances that face grazing conditions on this allotment, including wild horse numbers above the Appropriate Management Level (AML), an aging Allotment Management Plan (AMP), and yearly reductions in the permitted Animal Unit Months (AUM) for the allotment.

I would like to thank you for your sincere commitment to helping the BLM find solutions to these complex issues that are having an impact on our Public Lands and those that rely on them. The BLM is empathetic to this situation, and I would like to offer the following information on these challenges. First, we acknowledge that wild horse numbers are approaching 1,300 animals in the Beaty Butte vicinity, which is well above the 100-250 AML. Our national Wild Horse and Burro Program managers are aware of the conditions facing this Horse Management Area (HMA). Unfortunately, other HMAs have ranked higher on the national prioritization scale for horse gathers, and the Beaty Butte HMA has not been selected for gather as a result. Nationwide, only 1,650 animals were approved for removal during 2015 in response to court orders, issues of public health and safety, or private land impacts. I understand that this answer does not address your concerns; however, I hope that the stakeholders involved in the Beaty Butte collaboration effort, mentioned in your letter, may continue to engage in active discussions that help create positive, grassroots solutions for this HMA and potentially serve as a model for others that face similar conditions.

Second, while I understand that the AMP for this allotment is older, the permit for this allotment is not scheduled for renewal until 2019. The BLM has scheduled review and possible revision of the

AMP at that time. I would like to emphasize again, however, that continued, positive dialog within the core collaborative working group has the potential to yield agreements among stakeholders that could be instrumental in developing a revised AMP.

Lastly, we estimate that there will be 3,500-4,500 AUMs available for livestock grazing in the allotment in 2015. This does represent a decline from the 4,768 AUMs in 2014, and certainly the 15,501 AUMs available in 2013. This is not only a result of the factors that have been mentioned, but also the continued, serious drought conditions that the region has been experiencing.

Your dedication to the citizens that live and work in Harney and Lake Counties is undeniable. I truly appreciate that, given the many challenges that have been discussed, you and those you represent still demonstrate a willingness to find collaborative solutions and a path forward through the complexity of land management presented at Beaty Butte. The BLM will do all that we can to support that effort, and we are also willing to work with you to develop achievable interim solutions.

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM), Burns District Office, has prepared the Steens Mountain Comprehensive Recreation Plan (CRP) Environmental Assessment (EA) DOI-BLM-OR-B060-2009-0058-EA, Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI), and Decision Record (DR). The EA, FONSI, DR and maps are attached.

Having considered the Proposed Action, No Action, all other action alternatives and their associated impacts, and based on analysis in the CRP EA, it is our decision to implement various components from all alternatives analyzed. Except as specifically provided in the Decision through adoption of a component of an action alternative, BLM will continue the status quo of recreation management as described under the No Action Alternative.

This decision has multiple aspects, as such, it was broken into two sections: 1) Travel Management (including motorized and nonmotorized routes); and 2) Recreation Management. The Steens Mountain Travel Management Plan (TMP) will be amended to reflect changes to road maintenance, a change in maintenance terminology (maintenance level to maintenance intensity), designations of additional trails and roads, changes to road usage, and openings and closures of roads under the Decision. In addition, several recreational opportunities will be afforded to help manage recreation within and outside the Steens Mountain Cooperative Management and Protection Area (CMPA).

You have the right to appeal to the Interior Board of Land Appeals (IBLA), Office of the Secretary, within 30 days of receipt of this decision, in accordance with regulations at 43 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) § 4.4. A detailed explanation of the appeal process is included in the DR. Please note that a notice of appeal and/or request for stay

The Vale District Bureau of Land Management is proposing a multi-year, multi-phase project that would use a combination of prescribed fire, silvicultural thinning, and herbicide and mechanical invasive species treatments that include western juniper removal, to maintain and restore habitat for Greater Sage-Grouse and other sagebrush species in the Malheur Resource Area in eastern Oregon.

The Northwest Malheur County Greater Sage-Grouse Habitat Restoration Project is also expected to decrease the risk of high-severity fires, restore fire-resilient habitats and help wildfire suppression efforts that could prevent damage to sage-grouse habitat. Treatment activities would occur in phases over 15 years. Alternative treatment activities will be analyzed by a planned release of an Environmental Assessment (EA) for the project.

The Northwest Malheur County Greater Sage-Grouse Habitat Restoration Project

The Vale District Bureau of Land Management in eastern Oregon plans to implement a multi-year, multi-phased fuels management and habitat restoration project in the Malheur Resource Area.

The primary goal of the project is to maintain and restore habitat for Greater Sage-Grouse and other sagebrush species.

The plan would decrease the risk of high-severity fires by reducing hazardous fuels and improving vegetation health of forested areas within the project's sagebrush-steppe landscape. This could restore fire-resilient habitats, improving the vigor of fire-dependent areas and helping suppression efforts of wildfires damaging to sage-grouse habitat.

The Northwest Malheur County Greater Sage-Grouse Habitat Restoration Project Area is in the northwestern portion of Malheur County. Treatment areas would be north of Highway 20, west of Pole Creek Road, and south of Highway 26. The Project Area encompasses 258,556 acres, of which 144,671 acres are BLM-administered lands; 3,563 acres are Bureau of Reclamation-administered lands; 110,091 acres are private lands and a small amount are state- and U.S. Forest Service-owned. It is within the North Fork Malheur and Bully Creek Geographic Management Areas (GMAs). **A vicinity map is enclosed.**

More than 90 percent of the Project Area is considered either preliminary priority habitat or preliminary general habitat for Greater Sage-Grouse, as identified in the Oregon Draft Resource Management Plan Amendment and Environmental Impact Statement.

The project would use a combination of cutting encroaching undesirable conifer- predominately western juniper - and prescribed fire to meet the following goals:

- (1) Maintain and/or improve Greater Sage-Grouse habitat.
- (2) Reduce conifer encroachment to shift plant communities toward historic conditions.
- (3) Increase ecosystem resiliency to fire by reducing hazardous fuels and reintroducing fire as a disturbance.
- (4) Reduce invasive annual grass cover to interrupt the fire cycle and to shift plant communities toward historic conditions including sagebrush habitat.

Treatment methods would include broadcast burning, underburning, jackpot burning, pile burning, conifer cutting, silvicultural thinning, broadcast herbicide spraying, and competitive or restoration seeding and planting.

Treatment would result in about a 70 percent reduction in undesirable encroaching conifer density, over the next 15 years.

An Environmental Assessment will be released in summer or fall of 2015 with full project details and BLM's analysis of alternative management actions and their impacts. The public will have an opportunity to review and comment when that document is published.

I am pleased to announce the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) for the Malheur National Forest Site-Specific Invasive Plants Treatment Project has been completed. I have carefully considered the information in the FEIS and documented my decision to select Alternative B in a Draft Record of Decision (ROD). Both the FEIS and Draft ROD, along with additional information on the project, are available on the Forest website at:
<http://www.fs.usda.gov/project/?project=35614>.

The Draft ROD documents my rationale for the selection of Alternative B. Alternative B approves integrated invasive plant treatments throughout the Forest, including in wilderness areas. Alternative B allows for a wider variety of herbicides to be used on the Forest and includes an updated "Early Detection and Rapid Response" process that will provide a more timely and effective response to invasive plants found in any given year. Alternative B also amends the Malheur/Ochoco Land and Resource Management Plan (Forest Plan), adding the use of aminopyralid to the list of acceptable herbicides. All treatments will be done in a manner that minimizes risk of adverse effects. Alternative B is the most cost-effective of the alternatives.

Comments on the Draft EIS were received during the 45-day public comment period. The Forest Service addressed comments about the merits of the alternatives and the adequacy of the EIS analysis in the preparation of the Final EIS and Draft Record of Decision. Responses to comments are provided in Appendix D of the FEIS.

Administrative Review: My decision selects a project or activity implementing a land management plan that is not authorized under the Healthy Forests Restoration Act of 2003 (Pub. L. 108-148, 117 Stat 1887). Therefore, my decision is subject to pre-decisional administrative review and objection pursuant to subparts A and B of 36 CFR Part 218, subparts A and B. My decision includes a Forest Plan Amendment to authorize use of aminopyralid to treat invasive plants.

The Malheur National Forest Site-Specific Invasive Plants Treatment Project was originally scoped under the provisions of 36 CFR Part 215. For this project, individuals or organizations who submitted specific, written comments in response to scoping conducted under 36 CFR Part 215 or provided comments to the Draft EIS will be considered to have standing to object under 36 CFR Part 218, Subparts A and B.

Issues raised in objections must be based on previously submitted timely, specific written comments regarding the proposed project unless the issue is based on new information arising after the designated comment opportunities.



The following address should be used for objections sent by regular mail: Objection Reviewing Officer, USDA Forest Service, Pacific Northwest Region, Attn: 1570 Objections, PO Box 3623, Portland, OR 97208-3623. Objections delivered by mail must be received before the close of the fifth business day after the objection filing period.

Electronic submissions must be submitted in a format that is readable with optical character recognition software (e.g., MS Word, PDF, Rich Text Format) and be searchable. The objection must meet the content requirements of 36 CFR § 218.8(d), and include the following information: 1) the objector’s name and address, with a telephone number or email address, if available; 2) a signature or other verification of authorship upon request (a scanned signature for email may be filed with the objection); 3) when multiple names are listed on an objection, identification of the lead objector as defined in 36 CFR § 218.2 (verification of the identity of the lead objector shall be provided upon request); 4) the name of the project being objected to, the name and title of the responsible official, and the name of the national forest and ranger district on which the project will be implemented; 5) a description of those aspects of the project addressed by the objection, including specific issues related to the project and, if applicable, how the objector believes the environmental analysis or decision specifically violates law, regulation, or policy; suggested remedies that would resolve the objection; and supporting reasons for the reviewing officer to consider; and 6) a statement that demonstrates the connection between prior specific written comments on the particular project or activity and the content of the objection, unless the objection concerns an issue that arose after the designated opportunity for formal comment. With certain exceptions (36 CFR § 218.8(b)), all documents referenced in the objection must be included with the objection.

Objections, including attachments, must be filed within 45 days from the publication date of a “Legal Notice of the Opportunity to Object” for this project in the *Blue Mountain Eagle*, the newspaper of record. Attachments received after the 45-day objection period will not be considered. The publication date in the newspaper of record is the exclusive means for calculating the time to file an objection. Those wishing to object this project should not rely upon dates or timeframe information provided by any other source.

It is the objector’s responsibility to ensure timely filing of a written objection with the reviewing officer pursuant to 36 CFR § 218.9. All objections are available for public inspection during and after the objection process. Responses that do not adhere to these requirements make review of an objection difficult and are conditions under which the reviewing officer may set aside an objection pursuant to 36 CFR § 218.10.






